a short history of film second edition provides a concise and accurate overview of the history of world cinema detailing the major movements directors studios and genres from 1896 through 2012 accompanied by more than 250 rare color and black and white stills including many from recent films the new edition is unmatched in its panoramic view conveying a sense of cinema's sweep in the twentieth and early twenty first centuries as it is practiced in the united states and around the world wheeler winston dixon and gwendolyn audrey foster present new and amended coverage of the industry in addition to updating the birth and death dates and final works of notable directors their expanded focus on key films brings the book firmly into the digital era and chronicles the death of film as a production medium the book takes readers through the invention of the kinetoscope the introduction of sound and color between the two world wars and ultimately the computer generated imagery of the present day it details significant periods in world cinema including the early major industries in europe the dominance of the hollywood studio system in the 1930s and 1940s and the french new wave of the 1960s attention is given to small independent efforts in developing nations and the more personal independent film movement that briefly flourished in the united states the significant filmmakers of all nations and the effects of censorship and regulation on production everywhere in addition the authors incorporate the stories of women and other minority filmmakers who have often been overlooked in other texts engaging and accessible this is the best one stop source for the history of world film available for students teachers and general

audiences alike

with more than 250 images new information on international cinema especially polish chinese russian canadian and iranian filmmakers an expanded section on african american filmmakers updated discussions of new works by major american directors and a new section on the rise of comic book movies and computer generated special effects this is the most up to date resource for film history courses in the twenty first century
