contemporary and emergent theories of agrammatism provides an in depth review of the previous five decades of research on agrammatism focusing specifically on work which has been informed by linguistic theory the final chapters reflect the recent turning point in the conceptualization of the underlying causes of the impairments agrammatic individuals present with the book includes chapters on impairments to grammatical morphemes the tree pruning and trace deletion hypotheses verb deficits in sentences and as single words generalized minimality adaptation theory and slow syntax the involvement of discourse to facilitate student reading the writing is clear and accessible and the book includes a glossary of unfamiliar terms contemporary and emergent theories of agrammatism will be of great interest to advanced students and researchers in areas such as psychology of language linguistics neurolinguistics aphasiology and speech and language therapy

these papers emphasize the development of detailed models of normal cognitive functioning through the analysis of cognitive impairment they differ however in terms of the cognitive domain investigated and the dominant methodology of the reported research areas examined include imagery attention memory and language a substantial portion of the papers presented address language processing because research on language disorders has been a major focus of interest in cognitive neuropsychological research

a discussion of the relationship between the human body and language seems to be the inevitable result of any reflexion by man on his particular condition this has held true since the earliest records in written tradition it may be an excessively ambitious undertaking to try to catalogue the themes in that reflexion and reconstruct its successive stages within the confines of a book

of fairly modest proportions such as this one but the challenge has been stimulating enough to call for a response the long research work that preceded the writing of this book and the large collection of source material accumulated over a period of several years at least afford the writer the satisfaction of appreciating more than anyone else the care for accuracy and completeness that went into the gradual reduction of this text to manageable proportions moreover it is hoped to make available to all those interested at a later date the rich and rare corpus of documents that forms the basis of this book in an anthology of selected readings it was originally intended to publish these documents in a companion volume to this book

neural models of language processes offers an interdisciplinary approach to understanding the nature of human language and the means whereby we use it the book is organized into five parts part i provides an opening framework that addresses three tasks to place neurolinguistics in current perspective to provide two case studies of aphasia and to discuss the rules of the game of the various disciplines that contribute to this volume part ii on artificial intelligence ai and processing models discusses the contribution of ai to neurolinguistics the chapters in this section intro

this introduction to neurolinguistics is intended for anybody who wants to acquire a grounding in the field it was written for students of linguistics and communication disorders but students of psychology neuroscience and other disciplines will also find it valuable the introductory section presents the theories models and frameworks underlying modern neurolinguistics then the neurolinguistic aspects of different components of language phonology morphology lexical semantics and semantics pragmatics in communication are discussed the third section examines reading and writing bilingualism the evolution of language and multimodality the book also contains three resource chapters one on techniques for investigating the brain another on modeling brain functions and a third that introduces the basic concepts of neuroanatomy and neurophysiology this text provides an up to date linguistic perspective with a special focus on semantics and pragmatics evolutionary perspectives neural network modeling and multimodality areas that have been less central in earlier introductory works

a comprehensive introduction to the emerging fields of neurolinguistics and linguistic aphasiology stresses concepts from the contributing disciplines of neurology linguistics psychology and speech

dalila ayoun provides a broad overview of parameter setting theory in first and second language acquisition and refines the theory by revisiting and challenging the traditional assumptions that underlie it based on cross linguistic language data that cover a range of syntactic and phonological phenomena
