this book will not tell you how to teach reading teaching reading is in large measure a matter of making choices should you use basal readers or children's books or both should you teach children to read whole words or to sound out words letter by letter or both should you have three reading groups or four or no groups there are no right answers to these questions the answers depend on your personal philosophy your interpretation of the research the level at

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this book is an excellent tool for teachers who want to start readers workshops novel units or thematic studies in middle or high school literature classes there are ideas for writing book discussions journals whole class units literature circles and much more this text refers to the paperback edition

this book is a compendium of strategies it is not a description of a single approach nor is it intended to be eclectic the inclusion of a strategy should not be perceived as our endorsement of that strategy there are some strategies that we view as problematic there are others about which we disagree
