has a detailed bibliographical background section and an extensive bibliography which will be a useful source of reference to the primary literature although intended principally as a coursebook for students of syntax or english grammar transformational grammar will be invaluable to any reader who needs a straightforward and comprehensive introduction to the latest developments in this field
