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the encyclopedia of middle grades education provides a comprehensive overview of the field this publication includes seven anchor essays 5000 words that cover the following topics the history of the middle school movement academically excellent curriculum instruction and assessment developmental responsiveness in relation to young adolescents social equity in middle grades schools leadership in middle level schools teacher and administrator preparation and professional development and future directions in relation to the movement practices and policy leading scholars in the field of middle grades education were invited to author these essays in addition to the seven anchor essays the encyclopedia contains alphabetically organized entries short entries approximately 500 words long entries approximately 2000 words that address important concepts ideas terms people organizations and seminal publications related to middle grades education contributors to the encyclopedia have provided sufficient information so that the reader can place the idea concept person etc into its proper context in the history of the middle school movement entries are meant to be introductory after an overview of the essentials of the topic the reader is guided to more extensive sources for further investigation where appropriate the reader is also directed to electronic sources such as websites where additional information can be retrieved

the great proletarian cultural revolution occurred in the second decade after mao zedong and his comrades came to power in 1949 a comprehensive narrative account of this colossal event written by yan jiaqi one of the principal leaders of china s pro democracy movement and his wife gao gao a noted sociologist appeared in hong kong in 1986 and was quickly banned by the communist government not surprisingly censorship and restricted circulation in china resulted in underground reproduction and serialization the work was thus widely read coveted and appreciated by a populace who had just freed itself from the cultural drought and political dread of the event yan and gao later spent two years revising and expanding their work the present volume turbulent decade a history of the cultural revolution is based on the revised edition and has been masterfully edited and translated by d w y kwok in consultation with the authors following professor kwok s eloquent introduction and a short foreword in which the authors analyze the basic causes of the cultural revolution part one of the narrative focuses on the years 1965 1967 in two short years mao managed to turn public opinion against liu shaoqi president of the republic and launch the cultural revolution the reader is introduced to the red guards and encounters the cult of personality the first resistance to the cultural revolution the attack on zhou enlai and the persecution and death of liu shaoqi part two examines the rise and fall of lin biao during the years 1959 1971 lin s bid for power which began with the consolidation of his personal clique in the army and mass level persecution in the late stages of the cultural revolution ended in a failed coup and his death in an air crash part three follows jiang qing from 1966 to her arrest in 1976 for her part in instigating mass

violence and the persecution of key figures including zhou enlai during this period the political fortunes of deng xiaoping rose and fell for a second time the first protest at tiananmen square in 1976 ended in a bloody suppression and that same year the gang of four were arrested unlike social scientific treatments of political phenomena turbulent decade includes little discussion of economics still less of international relations and no institutional analysis instead the authors fervent belief in the truthful telling of history through its leading personalities pervades the work

from the ghostbusters hq in new york to nemo s fish tank in sydney from the phantom of the opera s parisian lair to scenes from grand theft auto in la this is an amazing atlas of imaginary locations in real life cities around the world locations from film tv books computer games and comics are ingeniously plotted on a series of beautiful vintage looking maps featuring 14 of the world s greatest cities the maps show exactly where your favourite characters lived loved worked and played and where iconic scenes took place the locations have been painstakingly tracked down mapped annotated and wittily divulged by the authors and an extensive index helps you find them all within the pages of this book you ll discover where in london super spies james bond and george smiley are neighbours the route of the exciting san francisco car chase in bullitt the tokyo homes of all the magical girls from the classic sailor moon anime and many more fascinating locations drawn from the world s imagination accompanying the maps are illuminating essays that explain how the authors came to their decisions along with explorations of the key locations and fun timelines of imaginary events find out how to get to sesame street where to join starfleet and thousands of other places besides in this indispensable guidebook to all those places you always wanted to visit if only they were real
