for the past quarter century on his kentucky farm wendell berry has lived out in practice the beliefs that have informed his writing both as a polemical ecologist and an admired stylist in prose and poetry his writings over twenty five titles currently in print include powerful and influential essays poem meditations and the sequence of four novels and a collection of short stories set in the fictional kentucky community of port william this volume the fourth in the confluence american authors series and the first full length study of wendell berry addresses both the diversity and unusual coherence of this classic body of work back cover

a sequence of poems in which berry writes of the land he and his wife hold in trust a farm they have tended for years and a new homestead they recently rescued from ecological disaster

he is unlike anybody else writing today after donald trump s election we urgently need to rediscover the best of radical america an essential part of that story is wendell berry few of us can live or even aspire to his kind of life but nobody can risk ignoring him andrew marr wendell berry is the most

important writer and thinker that you have probably never heard of he is an american sage james rebanks author of the shepherd s life wendell berry is something of an anachronism he began his life as the old times and the last of the old time people were dying out and continues to this day in the old ways a team of work horses and a pencil are his preferred working tools the writings gathered in the world ending fire are the unique product of a life spent farming the fields of rural kentucky with mules and horses and of the rich intimate knowledge of the land cultivated by this work these are essays written in defiance of the false call to progress and in defence of the local landscapes that provide our cultural heritage our history our home in a time when our relationship to the natural world is ruled by the violence and greed of unbridled consumerism wendell berry speaks out to defend the land we live on with grace and conviction he shows that we simply cannot afford to succumb to the mass produced madness that drives our global economy the natural world will not withstand it yet he also shares with us a vision of consolation and of hope we may be locked in an uneven struggle but we can and must begin to treat our land our neighbours and ourselves with respect and care we must as berry urges abandon arrogance and stand in awe

published in 1990 by gnomon press this volume combines two small books of poetry by wendell berry both with expanded texts in sayings and doings the inner lives of the country people berry knows so well surface in sayings stories reminiscences and a number of jocular dialogues many are expressions we hear and often mean to remember but when we start to retell them find that we have forgotten the exact wording without which they lose their effectiveness here the poet remembers well one can hear as one reads and the rural speech has been whittled so that not a syllable is wasted the condensed nature of sayings and doings is mirrored in the asian influence of an eastward look which includes haiku the journal like sequence a long journey and a small notebook and the masterful chinese painting poems for those familiar with many other collections of berry s poems this volume will acquaint them with other facets of his work until now too little known

poems espousing marriage responsibility and the values of an independent man with his own small farm
