among the many studies on german national socialism that have appeared in the last forty to fifty years one aspect has seldom been treated in detail the cultural representations of adolf hitler from the late 1920s to the present this book focuses on the image of hitler in literature photography historiography film philosophy theatre and comic books by major artists and scholars such as ernst ottwalt heinrich hoffmann bertolt brecht john hearfield leni riefenstahl charles chaplin theodor w adorno heiner muller and george tabori

josef strzygowski the polish austrian art historian of the vienna school of art history further articles include notes on warburg s serpent ritual lecture of 1923 his politico cultural initiative in 1914 1915 his work on caricature in particular the struwwelpeter topic and discussions on the topic of judaica the viennese art historian fritz saxl became his trusted friend and collaborator helping to gather warburg s large collection of books and photographs into the foundation of an academic institution in hamburg in the 1920s and then for a second time in london in the 1930s the warburg institute has become one of the world s leading centres of intellectual history cs 1109

the pulitzer prize nominated author recounts her holocaust experience her imprisonment at auschwitz and her dramatic escape in this book for young readers as world war ii rages in europe the fighting seems far away from isabella leitner and her family only rumors of nazi horrors have reached them and they feel safe in the small hungarian town of kisvarda that is until march 20 1944 overnight isabella s whole world changes suddenly she must wear a yellow star be inside by curfew and cannot go back to school and that s only the beginning her family is rounded up by nazi soldiers they are put in cattle cars and taken to auschwitz a death camp in poland only isabella and three of her sisters are kept together the rest of their family is forced to separate parts of the camp together the four girls face their worst fears until they get a chance at freedom the big lie offers a look at history through the eyes of a woman whose strength and hope helped her overcome the worst of human nature leitner s approach allows readers to appreciate the young isabella s incomprehension of the final solution even as she generates a coherent and compelling narrative publishers weekly

shortlisted for the peters book of the year a shocking story of rebellion and revelation set in a contemporary nazi england jessika keller is a good girl she obeys her father does her best to impress herr fisher at the bund deutscher model meetings and is set to be a world champion ice skater her neighbour clementine is not so submissive outspoken and radical clem is delectably dangerous and rebellious and the regime has noticed jess cannot keep both her perfect life and her dearest friend but which can she live without the big lie is a thought provoking and beautifully told story that explores ideas of loyalty sexuality and protest

on the murderous road to racial purity hitler encountered unexpected detours largely due to his own crazed views and inconsistent policies regarding jewish identity after centuries of jewish assimilation and intermarriage in german society he discovered that eliminating jews from the rest of the population was more difficult than he'd anticipated as bryan rigg shows in this provocative new study nowhere was that heinous process more fraught with contradiction and confusion than in the german military contrary to conventional views rigg reveals that a startlingly large number of german military men were classified by the nazis as jews or partial jews *mischlinge* in the wake of racial laws first enacted in the mid 1930s rigg demonstrates that the actual number was much higher than previously thought perhaps as many as 150 000

men including decorated veterans and high ranking officers even generals and admirals as rigorously documents for the first time a great many of these men did not even consider themselves jewish and had embraced the military as a way of life and as devoted patriots eager to serve a revived german nation in turn they had been embraced by the wehrmacht which prior to hitler had given little thought to the race of these men but which was now forced to look deeply into the ancestry of its soldiers the process of investigation and removal however was marred by a highly inconsistent application of nazi law numerous exemptions were made in order to allow a soldier to stay within the ranks or to spare a soldier's parent spouse or other relative from incarceration or far worse hitler's own signature can be found on many of these exemption orders but as the war dragged on nazi politics came to trump military logic even in the face of the wehrmacht's growing manpower needs closing legal loopholes and making it virtually impossible for these soldiers to escape the fate of millions of other victims of the third reich based on a deep and wide ranging research in archival and secondary sources as well as extensive interviews with more than four hundred mischlinge and their relatives rigorously study breaks truly new ground in a crowded field and shows from yet another angle the extremely flawed dishonest demeaning and tragic essence of hitler's rule

james tent recounts how these men and women from all over germany and from all walks of life struggled to survive in an increasingly hostile society even as their jewish relatives were disappearing into the east it draws on extensive interviews with twenty survivors many of whom were teenagers when hitler came to power to show how half jews coped with conditions on a day to day basis and how the legacy of the hatred

they suffered still lingers in their minds
