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high field magnetsâ those that operate at the limits of the mechanical and or electromagnetic properties of their structural materialsâ are used as research tools in a variety of scientific disciplines the study of high magnetic fields themselves is also important in many areas such as astrophysics because of their importance in scientific research and the possibility of new breakthroughs the national science foundation asked

the national research council to assess the current state of and future prospects for high field science and technology in the united states this report presents the results of that assessment it focuses on scientific and technological challenges and opportunities and not on specific program activities the report provides findings and recommendations about important research directions the relative strength of u s efforts compared to other countries and ways in which the program can operate more effectively

government initiatives in many countries emphasise social inclusion in higher education resulting in a more diverse student population this presents opportunities and challenges for academic and professional staff in managing and supporting these students managing and supporting student diversity in higher education focuses on how students succeed amidst a culture of widening participation the book is divided into seven chapters the first introduces current literature and policies to present an international perspective on widening participation in higher education the following five chapters present students stories on topics including getting into higher education the international experience coping with education later in life and identity stories are followed by implications for management and support and discussion topics for practitioners the book concludes by looking at how students succeed in higher education and the implications for managing and supporting student diversity provides an accessible and practical resource using students own voices emphasises how students from diverse backgrounds succeed in higher education offers in depth personal insights into issues facing learners from diverse backgrounds

this handbook discusses the theoretical and disciplinary background to the study of english medium instruction emi in higher education worldwide it highlights issues relating to emi pedagogy varying motivations for emi education and the delivery of emi in diverse contexts across the world the spread of english as a teaching medium and the lingua franca of the academic world has been the subject of various debates in recent years on the perceived hegemony of the english language and the domain loss of non english languages in academic communication encompassing a wide range of contributions to the field of emi the chapters of this handbook are arranged in four distinct parts part i provides an overview of english medium instruction in higher education worldwide part ii focusses on emi in europe part iii on emi in the middle east north africa and sub saharan africa and part iv on emi in the asian region the overall scope and level of expertise of this handbook provides an unrivalled overview of this field of education it serves as an essential reference for many courses dealing with applied linguistics english language education multilingualism sociolinguistics and related subjects at many levels of education including master s and phd level studies this handbook serves as a valuable edition for university libraries across the world and an essential read for many faculty undergraduate and postgraduate students educators and policymakers

there is an abundance of research saying that not only is leadership in higher education ineffective but also that it actually undermines the essential work that should be happening in universities christopher m branson maureen marra margaret franken and dawn penney provide a new insight into leadership that has proven to be far more effective for all involved the transrelational approach to leadership this new way of leading places an emphasis on the importance of the relationships that the leader develops with each and every person they are leading however in order to apply this new way of leading higher education institutions must change some of the key ways they work this book provides direction in how this can happen what benefits would result and offers a view on what the future for higher education might be if such changes to leadership are not made leadership in higher education from a transrelational perspective both critiques the likely implications of adopting this transrelational form of leadership into a higher educational institution and discusses the implications of not doing so although a transrelational approach to leadership

might seem daunting for higher education institutions to adopt is there any other choice the authors argue that it is inconceivable for institutions founded upon promoting human development as a consequence of research to ignore such research that not only questions the suitability of current leadership practices but also offers a more effective alternative

this text addresses the reforms in the financial and administrative structure of higher education government intervention in introducing new managerial techniques and quality audits and the implications of these changes for both academics and administrators it is one of a series of four volumes which look at the educational dilemmas facing governments professional educators and practising administrators in the current climate in education the issues are addressed from international and comparative perspectives

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
