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this book combines the disciplines of applied demography and public health by describing how applied demographic techniques can be used to help address public health issues besides addressing the impact of aging on health and health related expenditure cause specific mortality and maternal health and morbidity the book provides several chapters on special analysis and methodological issues the chapters provide a number of resources and tools that can be used in conducting research aimed at promoting public health these resources include information on a variety of health research datasets different statistical methodologies for analyzing health related data and developing concepts related to health status methodologies for forecasting or projecting disease

incidences and associated costs and discussions of demographic concepts used to measure population health status

this book demonstrates different statistical techniques for analyzing health related data as well as providing new techniques for forecasting and or projecting the incidence of diseases disorders it presents information on a variety of health related issues from the developed and developing world featuring cutting edge research from distinguished applied demographers and public health specialists the book bridges the gap between theory and research each chapter provides methods and materials that can be used to conduct further research aimed at promoting public health issues this book is intended for public health professionals health policy makers social epidemiologists administrators researchers and students in the fields of applied demography and public health who are interested in exploring the potential of ground breaking research or who want to further develop their existing research techniques it complements another volume in the applied demography series applied demography and public health springer 2013 which describes how applied demographic techniques can be used to help address public health issues

according to the classic and widely accepted statement by hauser and duncan 1959 2 demography is defined as the study of the size territorial distribution and components of population changes therein and components of such changes almost all disciplines of social sciences and most disciplines of natural sciences deal with human beings in one way or another either directly or indirectly furthermore demographic concepts e g birth rate death rate and migration and methods and analysis strategies e g life table analysis can be readily extended to other species insects animals plants etc and inanimate collectives enterprises automobiles etc clearly demography is an important thematic field in science and it may provide the empirical foundation for studying human beings animals and inanimate collectives on which other relevant scientific research is built the volume aims to be of value to the various audiences of both non specialists and experts who seek a comprehensive understanding of issues related to human population as reviewed in the very beginning of the theme introduction interdisciplinary is one of the three major features of demography given the rapid development in techniques for collecting not only demographic data but also other related data concerning health biomarkers genetics behaviors and social and natural environments in conventional population surveys as well as rapidly enhancing computing powers this volume shows and concludes that demography will be even more interdisciplinary in the coming decades a notable example is that the cross field marriage between bio medical sciences and demography will lead us to enter an era in which bio medical and demographic methods will be well integrated as indicated by james r carey and james w vaupel in chapter 13 of this volume the bio demographic branches of demography are vibrant areas of demographic research that are rapidly growing and that have great potential to enrich and enlarge the domain of demography not only can demographers learn much from biologists and epidemiologists but demographers can contribute much to research on life in general and to research on population health the increasing availability of data sources and much enhanced computing internet power will also lead demography to be more interactive with the other fields such as psychology environmental science economics business and management etc as discussed in this volume s chapter 11 by swanson and pol for example it is now possible to link conventional demographic data sources of census surveys and vital statistics with

administrative records such as social security tax reporting medical insurance hospital records school registration supermarket purchasing cards use etc while protecting individuals privacy such linkages will substantially increase the value of demographic methods surveys and administrative records for scientific research and policy analysis as well as the applicability of demography in business and governmental decision making processes

in this 3rd edition of the definitive work on health demography pol and thomas offer an updated view of the field and a current perspective on the applications of health demography to contemporary issues the significance of health demography within the field of population studies has continued to increase and this work provides background on the healthcare arena and systematically presents the various aspects of demography as they relate to healthcare this addition has been streamlined to focus on the important aspects of health demography and enhanced through the addition of charts maps and other graphics all statistics and tables have been updated and the most current references are included a separate chapter on morbidity has been included and the final chapter focuses on the public policy interface with health demography case studies and sidebars are included throughout the book to illustrate the applications of demography within the healthcare arena recent developments in u s healthcare are highlighted to give the text a very contemporary presence

in contrast to a typical general text in demography which is concerned with demographic principles trends problems and theories applied demography explores the practical issues with which demographers working for government agencies private nonprofit organizations and businesses deal it emphasizes the applications of applied demography in a variety of related disciplines such as geography economics gerontology public policy law sociology public administration and business management the data of these disciplines are taken into account as are the methods of statistics and computer sciences the book aims to inform the student of the wide range of applications of demography including not only narrowly demographic situations but also nondemographic situations such as manufacturing processes and the dynamics of organizations as a population

epidemiology and demography in public health provides practical guidance on planning and implementing surveillance and investigation of disease and disease outbreaks exploring contributing factors to the dynamics of disease transmission and the identification of population risks it also includes a discussion of ethics in epidemiology and demography including important issues of privacy vs public safety with a chapter on h1n1 and bird flu this book will be important for students and professionals in public health and epidemiology focuses on the techniques of surveillance and investigation of disease includes biostatistics and analysis techniques explores the ethics of disease studies includes chapter discussing h1n1 and bird flu
