were polar opposites in terms of appearance and behavior and their genealogies created temperamental and stylistic contrasts 3 the duel was held on a narrow ledge at weehawken just above the water hamilton had chosen the weapons a pair of highly decorated pistols owned by his wealthy brother in law john church 4 the duel was set up so that both men were armed with extremely powerful but extremely inaccurate weapons if struck in a vital spot by the oversized ball the chances of a serious or mortal injury were high
