diversity to enhance their ability to meet the needs of increasingly diverse students there is strong evidence payne allen 2006 neufeld roper 2003 that instructional coaching contributes to improved teaching and student learning however it should be noted that instructional coaching must also be accompanied by rigorous curriculum on going formative assessment and feedback for students strategic planning and strong local state and national leadership if educators are to eliminate existing gaps in opportunities to learn between white students and students of color
