portrait and self portrait almost a century later experimental filmmaker and artist lana lin has resurrected stein s project to tell a different story of queer love life and artistic collaboration at heart a candid chronicle of her partner lan thao s life journey from viet nam during the war and her own troubled history as a gender queer taiwanese american lin draws in subjects as varied as photography cancer tropical fruit 9 11 and eve sedgwick s eyeglasses weaving an intimate landscape of living that is also a critical investigation of race and gender
