a landmark of journalism and the art form of comics based on several months of research and an extended visit to the west bank and gaza strip in the early 1990s this is a major work of political and historical nonfiction

rafah a town at the southernmost tip of the gaza strip is a squalid place raw concrete buildings front rubbish strewn alleys the narrow streets are crowded with young children and unemployed men situated on the border with egypt swaths of rafah have been reduced to rubble rafah is today and has always been a notorious flashpoint in this most bitter of conflicts buried deep in the archives is one bloody

incident in 1956 that left 111 palestinian refugees dead shot by israeli soldiers seemingly a footnote to a long history of killing that day in rafah coldblooded massacre or dreadful mistake reveals the competing truths that have come to define an intractable war in a quest to get to the heart of what happened joe sacco arrives in gaza and immersing himself in daily life uncovers rafah past and present spanning fifty years moving fluidly between one war and the next alive with the voices of fugitives and schoolchildren widows and sheikhs footnotes in gaza captures the essence of a tragedy as in palestine and safe area goravde joe sacco s unique visual journalism has rendered a contested landscape in brilliant meticulous detail footnotes in gaza his most ambitious work to date transforms a critical conflict of our age into intimate and immediate experience

whether planning a new course or searching for new teaching ideas this collection is an indispensable compendium for anyone teaching the arab israeli conflict

finding expression in comic books television series and successful blockbuster films the superhero has become part of everyday life exploring the superhero genre its storytelling practices its hero types and its relationship with fans this anthology fills a gap in research about the comic book superhero of the last 20 years

this book explores how the heroes and villains of popular comic books and the creators of these icons of our culture reflect the american experience out of which they sprang and how they have achieved relevance by adapting to and perhaps influencing the evolving american character multiple generations have thrilled to the exploits of the heroes and villains of american comic books these imaginary characters permeate our culture even americans who have never read a comic book grasp what the most well known examples represent but these comic book characters and their creators do more than simply thrill they make us consider who we are and who we aspire to be icons of the american comic book from captain america to wonder woman contains 100 entries that provide historical background explore the impact of the comic book character on american culture and summarize what is iconic about the subject of the entry each entry also lists essential works suggests further readings and contains at least one sidebar that provides entertaining and often quirky insight not covered in the main entry this two volume work examines fascinating subjects such as how the superhero concept embodied the essence of

american culture in the 1930s and the ways in which comic book icons have evolved to reflect changing circumstances values and attitudes regarding cultural diversity the book s coverage extends beyond just characters as it also includes entries devoted to creators publishers titles and even comic book related phenomena that have had enduring significance

follow award winning cartoon journalist joe sacco on one of the most dangerous beats of all rock n roll the centerpiece of the book is an expanded version of in the company of long hair the early 90s graphic novelette sacco created on the subject of his raucous european tour with the punk band the miracle workers long hair appears here for the first time in an expanded version with an added 15 page section of his original sketches and notes from the time and a bound in cd featuring an excerpt from the miracle workers live shows including a blasting version of the iggy pop classic i got a right as for the rest of the book sacco turns his pitiless pen on all strata of rock n roll from old rockers two stories on the rolling stones to new from salacious gossip to how to woodstock in your own home from portraits of typical rock creatures record producer the musician who wanted to save the world the rock journalist to self deprecating autobiographical stories

joe sacco s breakthrough novel of graphic journalism has been widely hailed as one of the great graphic novels of all time having sold over 50 000 copies this special edition is the definitive hardcover collection of sacco s landmark of comic journalism in addition to the original 288 page graphic novel introduced by the late edward said this edition includes a host of unique supplemental never before published material including many of sacco s original background notes sketches photographic reference and a new interview with the author

these essays from various critical disciplines examine how comic books and graphic narratives move between various media while merging youth and adult cultures and popular and high art the articles feature international perspectives on comics and graphic novels published in the u s canada great britain portugal germany turkey india and japan topics range from film adaptation to journalism in comics to the current manga boom

what can literary theory reveal about discourses and practices of human rights and how can human rights frameworks help to make sense

of literature how have human rights concerns shaped the literary marketplace and how can literature impact human rights concerns essays in this volume theorize how both literature and reading literarily can shape understanding of human rights in productive ways contributors to theoretical perspectives on human rights and literature provide a shared history of modern literature and rights theorize how trauma ethics subjectivity and witnessing shape representations of human rights violations and claims in literary texts across a range of genres including poetry the novel graphic narrative short story testimonial and religious fables and consider a range of civil political social economic and cultural rights and their representations the authors reflect on the imperial and colonial histories of human rights as well as the cynical mobilization of human rights discourses in the name of war violence and repression at the same time they take seriously gayatri spivak's exhortation that human rights is something that we cannot not want exploring the central function of storytelling at the heart of all human rights claims discourses and policies

first runner up for the 2019 ray and pat browne award for the best edited collection in popular and american culture cultures of war in graphic novels examines the representation of small scale and often less acknowledged conflicts from around the world and throughout history the contributors look at an array of graphic novels about conflicts such as the boxer rebellion 1899 1901 the irish struggle for national independence 1916 1998 the falkland war 1982 the bosnian war 1992 1995 the rwandan genocide 1994 the israel lebanon war 2006 and the war on terror 2001 the book explores the multi layered relation between the graphic novel as a popular medium and war as a pivotal recurring experience in human history the focus on largely overlooked small scale conflicts contributes not only to advance our understanding of graphic novels about war and the cultural aspects of war as reflected in graphic novels but also our sense of the early twenty first century in which popular media and limited conflicts have become closely interrelated

a child in palestine collects the work of one of the arab world's greatest cartoonists naji al ali known as the palestinian malcolm x discovered in the 1950s he was revered throughout the region for his outspokenness honesty and humanity resolutely independent al ali strove to speak to and for the ordinary arab people the pointed satire of his stark symbolic cartoons brought him widespread renown his most celebrated creation the child hanthala exposed the brutality of israeli occupation the venality and corruption of the region's regimes and the suffering of the palestinian people hanthala is today seen as a surrogate witness to ongoing horrors and a beacon for palestinian

resistance

the blessing of an inherently interpretive medium like comics is that it hasn't allowed me to make a virtue of dispassion for good or for ill the comics medium is adamant and it has forced me to make choices in my view that is part of its message from the preface by joe sacco over the past decade joe sacco has increasingly turned to short form comics journalism to report from conflict zones around the world collected here for the first time sacco's darkly funny revealing reportage confirms his standing as one of the foremost international correspondents working today journalism takes readers from the smuggling tunnels of gaza to war crimes trials in the hague from the lives of india's untouchables to the ordeal of sub saharan refugees washed up on the shores of malta sacco also confronts the misery and absurdity of the war in iraq including the darkest chapter in recent american history the torture of detainees vividly depicting sacco's own interactions with the people he meets the stories in this remarkable collection argue for the essential truth in comics reportage an inevitably subjective journalistic endeavour among sacco's most mature and accomplished work journalism demonstrates the power of a great comics artist to chronicle lived experience with a force that often eludes other media

from our greatest living comics journalist minneapolis star tribune a revelatory investigation of deadly sectarian riots in uttar pradesh india that explores the mechanics dynamics mythologies uses and abuses of political violence everywhere compared to other episodes of lethal indian communal violence the clashes in uttar pradesh in 2013 the muzaffarnagar riot were a relatively small scale affair some scores of people were killed and several tens of thousands displaced it had happened before and will probably happen again hindus and muslims armed with guns and swords riled up by vitriolic rhetoric and a tangle of accusations turn on one another the truth fragments along religious lines both in the lead up to the rampage and in its bloody aftermath in the once and future riot joe sacco immerses himself in uttar pradesh speaking to government officials political leaders village chiefs and especially the victims who were mostly landless peasants in a quest to understand this riot as an archetype of political violence in the process he probes the role of savagery in a democracy the power of crowds rather than leaders to influence the course of events the collision of competing narratives and the accounts that perpetrators construct to explain away their participation in bloodshed hailed as the heir to r crumb and art spiegelman economist sacco has chronicled the urgent histories that define the world around us from the great war to gaza here he turns his masterful visual

reportage to a story that is specific to india but with implications and resonance for all precarious multiethnic multiracial societies everywhere

this important volume rethinks the conventional parameters of middle east studies through attention to popular cultural forms producers and communities of consumers the volume has a broad historical scope ranging from the late ottoman period to the second palestinian uprising with a focus on cultural forms and processes in israel palestine and the refugee camps of the arab middle east the contributors consider how palestinian and israeli popular culture influences and is influenced by political economic social and historical processes in the region at the same time they follow the circulation of palestinian and israeli cultural commodities and imaginations across borders and checkpoints and within the global marketplace the volume is interdisciplinary including the work of anthropologists historians sociologists political scientists ethnomusicologists and americanist and literary studies scholars contributors examine popular music of the palestinian resistance ethno racial passing in israeli cinema arab jewish rock euro israeli tourism to the arab middle east internet communities in the palestinian diaspora café culture in early twentieth century jerusalem and more together they suggest new ways of conceptualizing palestinian and israeli political culture contributors livia alexander carol bardenstein elliot colla amy horowitz lale khalili mary layoun mark levine joseph massad melani mc alister ilan pappé rebecca l stein ted swedenburg salim tamari
