cultural politics at the fin de siècle scrutinises ways in which current conflicts of race class and gender have their origins in the cultural politics of the last fin de siècle whose influence stretched from the 1890s when economic depression signalled the end of Britain's role as the workshop of the world to 1914 when world war accelerated imperial decline this collaborative venture by new and established scholars includes discussion of the new woman the reconstruction of masculinities and of feminism and empire the imperialist theme is pursued in essays on Yeats and Ireland Gilbert and Sullivan and the figure of the vampire the rise of socialism and psychoanalysis and the relationship between nascent modernism and late twentieth century postmodernism are also addressed in this radical account

that is critical of master narratives racism sexism and those technologies of power in schools that subjugate infantilize and oppress students the authors also develop a language of possibility that focuses on analyzing how power can be linked productively to knowledge how teachers can construct classroom social relations based on notions of equity and justice how critical pedagogy can contribute to an identity politics that is grounded in democratic relations and how teachers can develop analyses that enable students to become self reflective actors as they transform themselves and the conditions of their social existence

this volume addresses these key issues through an analysis of important theoretical debates on issues such as digital democracy cultural politics and transnational communities featuring contributors from both sides of the atlantic the book contains a series of case studies on new social movements including campaigns on the environment gender animal rights and human rights it combines cutting edge research with theoretical material and makes an important contribution to this highly topical and rapidly growing area this book will be invaluable reading for students in areas including politics communications and it sociology and cultural studies

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first published in 1989 cultural politics in contemporary america is a radical attempt to lay out the complex ways in which the american media and american culture is powerfully interlocked at the end of the 20th century the media exerted an overwhelming influence on the formation of social identity through the production and consumption of images the hollywood presidency of ronald reagan was founded on the skills of the great communicator bruce springsteen s born in the usa was used by chrysler corporation to assure that the pride is back feminists and right wing militants converged to oppose pornography the media american culture and political power were bound together in a gamble the stakes of which increased daily cultural politics incorporates the struggles of race gender and class the economy of the commercial media system the myths of hegemony and imperialism the crises of privacy and of the intellectual and such diverse issues as postmodernism the american automobile advertising as communication and television while political actors have changed and media technology has advanced rapidly the outcome of this research still holds true for the 21st century and is of importance to students of media

this collection examines the influence of raymond williams on the work of radical intellectuals it especially looks at the limitation of williams political vision and commitment

cultural politics while embodying the interdisciplinary coverage and discursive critical spirit of contemporary cultural studies emphasizes how cultural theories and practices intersect with and elucidate analyses of political power

cultural feelings mood mediation and cultural politics sets out to examine the role of feelings and mood in the production of social and cultural experience by returning to the work of raymond williams and informed by recent affect theory it treats feeling as a foundational term for cultural studies ben highmore argues that feelings are political and cultural forms that orchestrate our encounters with the world he utilises a range of case studies from twentieth century british culture focusing in particular on home front morale during the blitz the experiences of caribbean migration in the post war decades the music of post punk bands in the late 1970s and early 1980s and more recent state of the nation film and television including our friends in the north and this is england he finds evidence in oral history in films photographs television novels music policy documents and journalism through these sources this book tells a vivid and compelling story of our most recent history and argues that the urgent task for a progressive cultural politics will require the changing of moods as well as minds cultural feelings is essential reading for students and researchers with an interest in affect theory emotion and culture
