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brimming with advice and techniques this essential reference for book and songwriters clearly explains the fundamentals of the three crafts of a musical book music and lyrics using copious examples from classic shows frankel has created the quintessential musical writers how to among the topics definitions of musical theater differences between musical books and straight plays and between poetry and lyrics what a score is and how it develops how to write for the voice and how to audition musicals for producers with a new introduction and revised text frankel s work is ready to guide a new generation of aspiring writers

the broadway musical one of america s most distinctive contributions to western music has been chronicled dissected described and debated but never until now has its essential element that glorious music been analyzed directly in any significant detail moving beyond the anecdotes production histories and generalizations about theatrical style that mark so much of the critical literature joseph p swain offers a unique survey of the most important or representative musical plays one that shows how the great broadway composers have used the traditional tools of composition melody harmony tonal movement rhythm and texture to become powerful dramatists in their own right illustrated with over 150 musical excerpts a unique feature that gives swain s analysis unparalleled depth and precision the book yields new insights at every turn it shows how particular musical solutions to dramatic problems gave showboat and oklahoma the power to change the course of the broadway tradition brought carousel and west side story to worldwide recognition as masterpieces of their kind and lent a light popular genre the formal complexity and emotional range to encompass a tremendous diversity of styles and materials from shakespearean drama kiss me kate and west side story to european opera porgy and bess and from age old myth my fair lady and camelot to still current ethnic conflict fiddler on the roof all the great broadway composers and musical comedy teams are here jerome kern george gershwin rodgers and hammerstein frank loesser leonard bernstein lerner and loewe as well as a representative sample of the classic shows including the sadly neglected the most happy fella in addition swain s thoughtful evaluation of the current scene illuminates issues of dramatic approach godspell plot a chorus line subject matter jesus christ superstar and evita and musical rhetoric stephen sondheim s output exemplified by sweeney todd that may determine the future course of the musical play precise in focus uncommonly rich in detail and accessible to fans and scholars alike the broadway musical will have to be read by anyone concerned with contemporary american music and drama and by anyone who hopes truly to know this supposedly best known of music

the definitive history of the broadway musical the shows the stars the movers and the shakers showtime brings the history of broadway musicals to life in a narrative as engaging as the subject itself beginning with the scandalous astor place opera house riot of 1849 larry stempel traces the growth of musicals from minstrel shows and burlesques through the golden age of show boat and oklahoma to such groundbreaking works as company and rent stempel describes the broadway stage with vivid accounts of the

performers drawn to it and detailed portraits of the creators who wrote the music lyrics and stories for its shows both beloved and less well known but Stempel travels outside the theater doors as well to illuminate the wider world of musical theater as a living genre shaped by the forces of American history and culture he reveals not only how musicals entertain their audiences but also how they serve as barometers of social concerns and bearers of cultural values *Showtime* is the culmination of decades of painstaking research on a genre whose forms have changed over the course of two centuries in covering the expansive subject before him Stempel combines original research including a kaleidoscope of primary sources and archival holdings with deft and insightful analysis the result is nothing short of the most comprehensive authoritative history of the Broadway musical yet published

In this lively book Stacy Wolf illuminates the women of American musical theater performers creators and characters from the start of the Cold War to the present day creating a new feminist history of the genre moving from decade to decade Wolf highlights the assumptions that circulated about gender and sexuality at the time and then looks at the leading musicals stressing the aspects of the plays that relate to women the musicals discussed here are among the most beloved in the canon *West Side Story* *Guys and Dolls* *Cabaret* and many others with special emphasis on *Wicked*

a highly original incisive and spirited examination of the rise heyday and decline of American musical theatre

This second edition offers theater lovers an illuminating behind-the-scenes tour of some of America's best musicals Geoffrey Block provides a documentary history of each of the eighteen musicals he discusses he reveals how the American musical evolved from the 1920s to today both on stage and on screen and how librettist lyricist composer and director work together to shape pieces book cover

detail in the a to z of the broadway musical through a chronology an introductory essay a bibliography and 900 dictionary entries on broadway shows playwrights directors producers designers and actors this handy desk reference offers quick information on the many aspects of the broadway musical

three out of four broadway bound musicals fail to get there and many of those that do ultimately fail the broadway musical takes an engrossing look at the industry s successes and failures in an effort to understand the phenomenon of mass collaboration that is broadway the authors investigate the complicated machinery of show business from its birth around the turn of the century through its survival of the cost explosions of the 1980s through interviews with many of broadway s top producers directors designers actors songwriters lyricists librettists musicians and other artists they lead us on an intimate tour of the creative process they also explore the roles of top executives and the reactions of critics and audiences they conclude with a fascinating look at the inherent conflicts and tensions that have resulted in some of the most seamless and best loved productions on broadway fans of the genre as well as scholars and students of american culture will delight in this revealing insider s look at the scenes behind the scenes and the history of one of america s most popular forms of entertainment the effort that goes into making a broadway musical is enormous first requiring the enthusiasm of a group of initial creative artists and then the cooperation of hundreds of talented individuals and the investment of millions of dollars before each show is ready to open each venture is marked perhaps more by conflict than collaboration and the continuation of the industry seems more remarkable when it is revealed that three out of four broadway musicals fail to break even on broadway what goes into the making of a successful musical no venture can be a success without good collaboration but whether it is good or bad in any specific case cannot be known beforehand the broadway musical is an investigation into this phenomenon of collaboration and its seeming unpredictability to gather information bernard rosenberg and ernest harburt have interviewed many of the top producers directors designers players songwriters lyricists librettists and other artists that are responsible for today s broadway musicals starting with the development of the industry itself the authors investigate the complicated machinery of show business and detail how it was able to survive the rapidly rising costs of productions in the 1980s proceeding to the creative aspects of the show the authors provide an intimate look at the assembling of the musical at every level detailing the workings of the top executives musicians songwriters techne the reaction of the critics and the audience the book concludes with a lengthy look at the phenomenon of collaboration itself describing the inherent conflict and tension that often adds to the production of a broadway musical the broadway musical is an engrossing look at the successes and failures of this most elaborate form of live entertainment

the dean of broadway musical directors examines the dynamics of how the book music and lyrics work together to create such hits as my fair lady fiddler on the roof guys and dolls hair pal joey west side story company south pacific threepenny opera and porgy and bess howard kissel chief theater critic for the new york daily news extends the reach of engel's subjects by bringing them up to date with commentary on such shows as a chorus line nine sunday in the park with george rent working and falsettos kissel offers a thoughtful history on how musical theater has evolved in the three decades since engel wrote words with music 1972 and how engel's classic work remains vital and illuminating today

the broadway song companion is the first complete guide and access point to the vast literature of the broadway musical for the solo performer designed with the working actor in mind the volume lists every song from over 210 broadway shows giving the name of the character's who sing's the song its exact vocal range and categorizing each by song style uptempo narrative ballad swing ballad moderate character piece etc a number of indexes to the volume list titles of songs first lines composer's and lyricist's names and each song by voice type for instance a soprano looking for a ballad to sing will find every song in that category in the index all solos duets and trios are indexed in this manner with quartets and larger ensembles listed by voice type furthermore the instant breakdowns how many lead characters who sings what song and the range requirements of each character will be a valuable resource to directors and producers

to see a broadway musical is to experience how a drama using melody harmony and rhythm evokes the emotion needed to perpetuate a story line without music many of these plays would not succeed failing to convey the intended message this new edition of swain's classic text winner of the 1991 ascap deems taylor award reveals how a musical drama achieves plot movement character development and conflict through strategic placement of song and music in 20 musical plays unlike critical literature that has simply explored theatrical style and production histories this survey focuses mainly on the power of music illustrated with more than 150 musical excerpts and essays swain includes the latest research and viewpoints of contemporary critics offering insight into dramatic expression and how renowned composers including jerome kern george gershwin jerry bock stephen sondheim and andrew lloyd webber influenced the broadway musical this provides insights into the many impressive musicals to hit the stage between the years of 1927 and 1987 illuminating how specific revisions to productions such as showboat and oklahoma forever changed their popularity learn how music is used as a symbol for psychological or emotional action from shakespearean drama's such as kiss me kate and west

side story to more current dramas including *Godspell*, *A Chorus Line* and *Jesus Christ Superstar* replete with a never seen before essay on *Les Misérables* this edition also includes an expanded epilogue highlighting the phenomena behind *Miss Saigon* and *Phantom of the Opera* megamusicals that changed the direction of the Broadway tradition for professors of dramatic arts and people interested in Broadway musicals theater popular music and opera

this guide to seventy five Broadway musicals of the last 100 years which are most often produced by amateur and professional groups gives plot synopses Broadway production information including dates casts writers lyricists and composers film versions and photographs from the original Broadway production

20 seasons Broadway musicals of the 21st century catalogues categorizes and analyzes the 269 musicals that opened on Broadway from the 2000 2001 season through the 2019 2020 season this book is the first to comprehensively examine the musicals that premiered on Broadway during this important historical period which was bookended by the 9 11 terrorist attacks on one end and the coronavirus pandemic on the other it begins by exploring the historical context for the first 20 years of the 21st century and how this impacted

american culture and theatre rather than chronologically the musicals are then organized into categories based on their source material and whether they were original musicals or revivals painting a detailed picture of the broadway musical in first 20 years of the 21st century jukebox musicals screen to stage musicals revivals and original musicals are all covered and each chapter ends with reading guides and discussion prompts the book not only discusses what was produced but by whom uncovering the stark lack of representation for women and artists of color on broadway musical creative and design teams additionally the last chapter discusses the coronavirus pandemic the broadway shutdown and what happened to the broadway musical during the shutdown including the response to the black lives matter movement in the summer of 2020 20 seasons broadway musicals of the 21st century will appeal to fans and scholars of musical theatre as well as students of musical theatre musical theatre history american studies and pop culture studies

the 1920s represented a turning point in the history of the broadway musical breaking with the vaudeville traditions of the early twentieth century to anticipate the more complex sophisticated musicals of today composers jerome kern george gershwin cole porter richard rodgers and their contemporaries revitalized the musical with the sound of jazz and other new influences productions became more elaborate with dazzling sets tumultuous choreography and staging tricks all woven into tightly constructed story lines these dramatic changes of the 1920s ushered in the golden age of the american musical theater ethan mordden captures the excitement and the atmosphere of broadway during the 1920s in make believe in captivating lively prose mordden describes in superb detail the stars the songs the jokes the sheer fun of this era here are shows great interesting or even bizarre sally the student prince rose marie lady be good no no nannette rainbow good news ziegfeld follies the coconuts the 5 oclock girl blossom time whoopee early on the charisma of entertainers such as the bragging al jolson you ain t heard nothin yet the bewitching marilyn miller the madly prancing eddie cantor the unpredictable gertrude lawrence and the indescribable marx brothers were the essential element in a hit musical but as mordden demonstrates the stars lost power and the authors took control as shows like desert song peggy ann strike up the band and sweet adeline reinvented the old forms the musical became more adult too baiting the censor in the lyrics of lorenz hart cole porter and b g desylva and broadway became more racially integrated with blackface acts dying out while all black musicals such as shuffle along and the blackbirds shows enjoyed mainstream success make believe reaches its climax with morddens deep look at jerome kern and oscar hammerstein s 1927 masterpiece show boat with its intricate story line spanning four decades its gala interracial cast its stunning physical production its powerful score including ol man river bill mis ry s comin aroun can t help lovin dat man life on the wicked stage and why do i love you show boat was the first american musical universally hailed as a classic fusing the decade s developments into one epic show kern and hammerstein created something at once timeless and contemporary the ultimate twenties show but as producer florenz ziegfeld called it on the posters the all american musical comedy

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
